General Conditions of Visit

The Cass Sculpture Foundation is a 26 acre ancient woodland, landscaped for exhibiting monumental commissions in an outdoor environment. We suggest sensible footwear is worn in all conditions as some visitors may find some areas difficult to access. We aim to maintain paths and walkways, however, due to the nature of our charity, the weather and general movement of our sculptures can affect the quality of the ground underfoot. Whilst we take all necessary safety precautions, the Foundation does not accept liability for personal injury or the loss of private property during your visit.

The Cass Sculpture Foundation is home to over £6m worth of sculpture and, as such, we ask that visitors act with the requisite due care when visiting the estate. Because everything in the grounds is for sale, the sculpture estate is more like an outdoor showroom than a public park. Please make your students aware of the following:

- To take care not to damage the sculptures or grounds
- To remain on the dedicated paths and keep out of areas marked "PRIVATE"
- To take all litter off site
- To please not climb on any of the sculptures.
- To remain at safe distance from the pond (see wayround)
- To respect other visitors to the sculpture park
- To only use the gallery and dear hut as shelter from the elements
- To keep noise to a minimum
- To consume food and drink only in designated areas (please ask for details)



Please note that visitors are responsible for incurring the cost of any damages to sculpture or property on the estate.
